## 2. Academic Activities

As the second term comes to a close, we want to take a moment to reflect on the enriching academic experiences your child has had over these past few months. We are thrilled to share with you some of the highlights from this term:

Invitation of Professionals and Artisans: Throughout the term, we welcomed
professionals and artisans to our school to provide real-life experiences across
various subjects. From medical doctors sharing insights from the general hospital to

- carpenters demonstrating their craft, our students had the opportunity to learn from experts in their fields.
- Super Collaborative Teaching: Our teachers have been collaborating both within
  and outside their departments, fostering a culture of teamwork and innovation. This
  collaborative approach has enriched the learning experience for our students,
  providing diverse perspectives and engaging lessons.
- Daily Mathematics Problem Solving: Mathematics skills are essential, and to strengthen them, our students engaged in daily mathematics problem-solving sessions in all classes. This consistent practice has deepened their understanding and confidence in tackling mathematical challenges.
- 4. Peer Teaching: Selected students took on the role of peer teachers for subjects like mathematics, physics, and chemistry. This peer-to-peer learning not only reinforced understanding but also promoted leadership and communication skills among our students.
- 5. Organized Intervention Classes: After thorough analysis of Continuous Assessment Tests (CT), we organized intervention classes across all subjects to provide targeted support to students who needed additional assistance. These sessions were tailored to address specific learning needs, ensuring that every student had the opportunity to succeed.
- 6. **Special Center for CT and Examination:** Recognizing that children do not all learn in the same way and neither do they all process what they are taught in the same way, special interventions were made to accommodate such students in the way we teach and assess them. Hence the creation of special centers during the Centralized Test and in the just concluded 2<sup>nd</sup> term examination.
- 7. **Weekly Essay Writing:** Our English language classes included weekly essay writing sessions, allowing students to hone their writing skills and express their thoughts effectively. These sessions encouraged creativity and critical thinking, essential skills for success in any field.

- 8. **Hausa Text Writing:** For our Hausa students, we introduced a program focused on Hausa text writing, empowering them to express themselves in Hausa language in writing poems, essays, etc.
- 9. Saturday Mathematics Clinic: To offer additional support in mathematics, we hosted Saturday mathematics clinics where students could receive personalized guidance and assistance from teachers. These clinics provided an opportunity for targeted remediation and reinforcement of key concepts.
- 10. Saturday Science Practical Lessons: Hands-on learning experiences were provided through Saturday science practical lessons, allowing students to apply theoretical knowledge in a practical setting. These interactive sessions sparked curiosity and fostered a deeper understanding of scientific principles.
- 11. **Constant Supervision:** We maintained constant supervision of classes to ensure a safe and conducive learning environment for all students. Our dedicated staff members were vigilant in their oversight, prioritizing the well-being and academic progress of every student.
- 12. **Mentoring of English Language Teachers:** Our commitment to excellence extended to our teaching staff, with ongoing mentoring and support provided to our English language teachers.
- 13. The academic adviser organized the following activities: various individual sessions handling learning difficulties also took place, group sessions tackling academic difficulties, Post Centralized Test academic counseling supports, Career Test and Career Exploration sessions organized, Etc.

- Basketball friendly matches (boys and girls) with Ahmadu Bahago Secondary School, Mawo Secondary School (Junior and senior boys), Jimorota selected team of boys and girls.
- Internal and external football matches; our football team played friendly matches with FOMWAN FC, City Rivals FC. The internal matches were between SS3 boys against SS1 and SS2 boys, and SS3 boys against the rest of the school.
- The student affairs organized counseling sessions with a total of 44 students this term. They also had counseling sessions with over 15 different groups. They had 37 class meetings with various classes this term.

### 4. Islamiyyah Report

All praise be to Allah that we have reached the conclusion of the second term of our Islamiyyah activities. While perfection remains elusive, we are pleased to report significant strides forward thanks to new initiatives and approaches aimed at holistic improvement. It is imperative to remind parents that the essence of our Islamiyyah and educational endeavors at NHC is to guide students towards proficiency in recitation with proper tajweed, exemplary adab, a thorough understanding of Islam, and a strong foundation for Quranic memorization to the best of each individual's ability. Our objective does not solely revolve around the memorization of the entire Quran, as various factors such as time constraints and competing interests, including the National Curriculum and Home-grown curriculum, contribute to our commitment to providing a

comprehensive and well-rounded education. Sister Salatu articulated this clearly during the PTA Online General Meeting. Below, we outline some of the initiatives and activities in which students or Malams have engaged this term.

- Rotation of Malams on Friday to teach tajweed lessons using the white board in each class.
- Tajweed intra class competition was organized at two different occasions in order to enhance the understanding of the content taught in class practically.
- Some students were selected for recording of recitation which would be aired on television and other media houses during this month of Ramadan. This was done at the Islamic Education Trust recording studio.
- Submission of Tracking Records: Tracking records, documenting progress, were submitted on a weekly basis for comprehensive verification.
- Analysis of Second Term Exam Results: Following the Second Term exam, a
  meticulous analysis of students' results was conducted to identify those requiring
  intervention classes. This proactive approach began in the first term, will in sha
  Allah continue in 3<sup>rd</sup> term.
- A screening was conducted for some SS3 girls who want to transit to Tahfiz category in order to participate in the Walimah planned for 3<sup>rd</sup> term. The criteria for an SS3 student to participate in the Walima, is such that the student must be in the Tahfiz class. A certain target has been set for SS3 Tahfeez students who want to participate in the Walima.
- An assignment for parents who are interested in their children improving on their recitation and memorization will in sha Allah be sent next week via the usual channels used by the school.

# 5. **GCE Result 2024**

We are pleased to share with you our recently released GCE results, which have shown a remarkable improvement across the board compared to the previous year. We are thrilled

to report an increase in the number of distinctions achieved by our students, reflecting their dedication and hard work throughout their academic journey.

Furthermore, we have observed a significant drop in the number of pass and fail grades, indicating a positive trend in overall academic performance. This achievement is a testament to the collective efforts of our students, teachers, and encouragement from parents.

We commend our students for their commitment to excellence and congratulate them on their well-deserved success. We also extend our gratitude to our dedicated teachers for their tireless efforts in guiding and mentoring our students towards academic excellence.

We have swung into action by arranging support for the students who obtained Pass and Failed grades, by hiring a consultant (with a reputable track record of getting students to get a minimum of Credit grade, to work with these students.)

# 6. Fostering the spirit of Ramadan at home during the break

As explained by sister Salatu during her report on Sunday when we had the online PTA General Meeting, we have engaged the students in many activities to instill and foster the spirit of Ramadan since we entered this holy month; hence, we are soliciting the assistance of parents to build on this when our children come home for the holiday, by ensuring they do not spend the rest of Ramadan watching movies, playing video games, spending all their time on their phones or on social media.

### 7. Students leaving Luggage in School: Matters Arising

As per the discussions held during the online PTA General Meeting, we have devised a plan to address the challenges encountered regarding the storage of students' luggage during mid-term and end-of-term breaks. Below, you will find the guidelines and penalties associated with non-compliance:

- Masking tapes will be provided for students to tag their luggage, which must be deposited for safekeeping.
- Unlike previous arrangements, hostel staff will not conduct an inventory of the
  contents of each student's luggage due to time constraints and logistical
  challenges. Instead, a designated hotel room will be allocated to each class. Once
  the last member of the class has deposited their luggage, the room will be
  securely locked. It is important to note that any complaints regarding misplaced
  property within the luggage will not be entertained, as the act of leaving luggage
  is done at the owner's risk.
- To mitigate the issue of students failing to claim their luggage promptly, which
  occurred during previous instances, thereby hindering the timely evacuation of
  rooms for their owners, the following penalty system will be implemented: For
  each day that a student's luggage remains unclaimed, a fine of N5,000 will be
  levied.

We trust that these measures will ensure a smoother and more efficient process for the storage of students' luggage during breaks. Your cooperation and adherence to these guidelines will be greatly appreciated.

## 8. **Boarders Feeding Levy**

For the benefit of parents who missed the online PTA General Meeting of Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> March 2024, the school management presented a proposal for boarders feeding levy of N50,000 based on the food crises brought on as a result of removal of fuel subsidy, and

exacerbated by the forex crisis. Short of reducing the number of times students are fed, the school has no choice but to introduce the levy as it has borne the deficit for two terms now. If parents recall, the school fees was fixed at 30% in February 2023, and at the moment general weighted inflation is 31% plus, whereas the food inflation is over 100%!

Alhamdulillah, the parents present during the meeting unanimously agreed that the school should go ahead with the boarders feeding levy of N50,000. Consequently, all boarders are to pay the levy on or before resumption in 3<sup>rd</sup> term. No boarder will be allowed to enter the hostel without payment of the levy.

# 9. Boarders' late resumption to school

We are noting with increasing alarm the rising rate of lateness by boarders on days of resumption. When the hostel staff probe the students on why they are late, most times the explanation rendered does not agree with what parents called ahead to report to the school Registrar. Henceforth, any student whose parents call ahead with the excuse he or she is ill, will have to tender a medical report upon resumption.

In addition, any student who delays in resuming on time without any cogent reason will be sanctioned according by the school management.

# 10. Checking Newsletter and Behavioural Report Online

Alhamdulillah, the second term examinations have been concluded. parents can access their child's report through the link <a href="https://nhcminna.org/resultchecker">https://nhcminna.org/resultchecker</a>, as from Friday 5<sup>th</sup> of April, 2024.

Upon clicking the link, a result checker will open, prompting you to input your child's admission number. Subsequently, a drop-down menu will appear, offering three options: report sheet, student behavioral report, and pocket money report. <u>Parents are kindly requested to check their ward's behavioral report after reviewing the academic report.</u>

11. Resumption date/time for 2<sup>nd</sup>term

The school is scheduled to resume in sha Allah on Saturday, 20<sup>th</sup> April, 2024, on or

before 5 pm.

We earnestly pray to Allah for the protection of our children throughout the holiday

season and for their safe return to school when the time comes.

Parents are hereby reminded that it is mandatory to contact the school in advance should

any circumstance arise that hinders them from returning their child/children on or before

the specified time. Your timely communication is greatly appreciated. Please note, no

child will be allowed into the school after 5pm on the day of resumption.

Finally, it is important to note that the school does not admit students into the hostel on

Sundays. This is due to the fact that both the Bursary and Administrative staff essential

for processing student admissions, do not work on that day, because they need the

breather to be ready for work on Monday.
